DAY 3 LONDON





- British Museum: Also known as the British Museum, it is one of the largest and most well-known museums
 in the world. The museum houses more than 7 million cultural relics and treasures from all over the world,
 and the number and variety of collections are rich, which is rare in museums around the world.
- Westminster Abbey: Also known as Westminster Abbey, located on the north bank of the River Thames, is an Anglican chapel, and it is also the place where successive kings were crowned and members of the royal family were married, and Prince William's wedding was held here.
- Buckingham Palace (exterior): Built between 1703 and 1705, Buckingham Palace is now the place where the
 Queen of England works and lives in London, the administrative headquarters of the royal family, and one
 of the few royal palaces still in use in the world today.
- London Eye (exterior): The London Eye, also known as the Millennium Wheel, is located on the south bank
 of the River Thames and was built by the United Kingdom to celebrate the arrival of 2000. This giant Ferris
 wheel is 135 meters tall and overlooks London.
- Big Ben (exterior): Big Ben, is a newspaper clock on the clock tower at the north end of the British
 Parliament building, built in 1858 on the banks of the River Thames, nearly 100 meters high. Almost every
 visitor to the UK comes here for a group photo. The bell tower strikes every fifteen minutes to emit the
 classic melodious Westminster bell, and on the hour it rings a deeper resonant bell.

- Tower Bridge: is one of London's landmarks and symbol of London. The sidewalk offers views of the upper and lower reaches of the River Thames. If you encounter the Mist Lock Bridge, the scenery is even more exceptional, and the Foggy Lock Tower Bridge is one of the attractions in London.
- Tower of London: The Tower of London is a castle that began as a royal palace and later served various purposes such as fortresses, armories, execution grounds, prisons, etc., and was listed as a World Heritage Site in 1988.

Day 4 London — Bath — Windsor — London





- · Wake up early and head to the World Heritage town of Bath (2.5h)
- "The keys of the Bath Abbey, shining with light, painted glass windows, decorated with Gothic churches..."
 Although this is the lyric from "Prague Square", it is most appropriate to describe Bath Abbey.
- Roman Baths: Located in the center of Bath, directly opposite the Bath Abbey, it is the attraction of Bath
 and the origin of the English name Bath in Bath.
- Royal Crescent (exterior): Located on a quiet highland north of Bath's city centre, echoing the circular square, it is one of Britain's more imposing large ancient buildings, it was built in 1775, but the elegant charm has not diminished to this day.
- Windsor Castle: One of the official residences of the Queen of England, it is also one of the larger and
 oldest castles in the world that is still inhabited. Along with Buckingham Palace in London and
 Holyroodhouse Palace in Edinburgh, Windsor Castle is the Queen's main administrative residence, where
 official and private events are often held.
- Returned to London and stayed in London that night

Later, it was full of historical significance, and the "Paris Peace Treaty" and "Versailles Peace Treaty" were signed here. In 1833, after the French Revolution, it was converted into a museum of French history. Stay in Paris tonight

DAY 6 Paris





- Louvre Museum: The museum has a collection of 400,000 pieces, exhibits spanning more than 1,500 years, ancient Greece, ancient Rome, ancient Egypt and other civilization treasures are beautifully presented here. The exterior opera house, the Palais Garnier was built in 1875, grand in scale and resplendent, the façade is covered with a large number of ornaments, the interior is gorgeous, the four walls and colonnades are covered with Baroque statues, hanging lamps, paintings, etc., like a jewelry box full of gold and silver jewelry.
- · Visit the Arc de Triomphe, one of the four representative buildings of the city of Paris
- Champs-Élysées: The Champs-Élysées is the most famous street in Paris. You can also shop at Galeries Lafayette nearby and enjoy shopping.
- Eiffel Tower (exterior): Standing on the south bank of the Seine-et-Marne River in the Champ de Mars in Paris, France, it is a world-famous building and one of the symbols of French culture.
- Place de la Concorde, Paris: The Place de la Concorde is one of the most famous squares in France and one of the most beautiful squares in the world.

Seine: Experience Seine in the evening The Seine is the second largest river in France that flows through
the center of Paris, the north bank of the Seine is called the right bank and the south bank is called the left
bank; The right bank is the main business district and political center of Paris, and the left bank has coffee
shops and the Latin Quarter, full of literary atmosphere.

 Paris City Hall is a magnificent Renaissance-style building with arched doors and windows and fine carvings. Free shopping at the Champs-Élysées in Paris.

- Zansers Hans (Windmill Village): Located 15 km north of Amsterdam, the Netherlands, the windmill village is an ancient building that vividly depicts Dutch life in the 17th and 18th centuries.

DAY 11 Amsterdam





- Rijksmuseum: It houses a large collection of well-known art treasures, including masterpieces by many famous masters.
- Royal Palace Amsterdam: One of the four royal palaces in the Netherlands, formerly the town hall and
 courthouse, it is still full of vitality today as the political and economic center of the city, as well as an
 important square in the city and a favorite theme of painters. The main attraction here is its architectural
 structure and the ornate decoration of the royal palace.
- Amsterdam's Red Light District: This is the weathered district of Amsterdam, located on both sides of the
 two canals of Oudezijds Voorburgwal and O.Z. Ahterburgwal in the Old Town, intersecting with the canal for
 six or seven streets and more than a dozen blocks.
- Heineken Museum + Amsterdam Canal Cruise: The Heineken Beer Museum was formerly a century-old
 Heineken brewery, which was transformed into an exclusive Heineken beer museum in 1988.
- Amsterdam Canals: Completed in the 17th century, the Amsterdam Canal Belt is unique in the world as a
 work of art of urban construction, and a concrete embodiment of the political, economic and cultural
 flourishing of Amsterdam during the Dutch "Golden Age". Its attractions are mainly concentrated in the
 canal belt with a radius of 1.5 km

- Hohenzollern Bridge: is the oldest bridge in Cologne, consisting of three railway bridges and pavements.
 Connecting the cathedral, the Hohenzollern Bridge across the Rhine is undoubtedly a beautiful sight
- St. Martin's Grande: A Roman Catholic church, known for its magnificent quartered base top and clover-like ground shape.
- Palazzo Benrat: Very beautiful Rococo buildings exist throughout Europe
- · Visit one of the most elegant shopping streets in the world: the Rajpass.

 and many beautiful buildings, which is an excellent place to see the Grand Canyon, Adolf Bridge, and the
 castle combination.
- Church of Our Lady: Located in the heart of Luxembourg City, it was built between 1613 and 1621.
- The famous street of Luxembourg Liberty Avenue leads to the Adolf Bridge on the edge of the valley and has become one of the few historic avenues in Luxembourg City.

DAY 14 Luxembourg — Germany: Frankfurt

 Frankfurt Cathedral is a Gothic church built between the 13th and 15th centuries, which became the coronation place of Germanic kings in the 14th century, where ten Holy Roman Emperors were crowned, hence the name "Emperor's Cathedral".
- Old Town Hall: This is one of Frankfurt's landmarks. Located on the Roman Forum, the three gabled buildings are the municipals of Frankfurt.
- Goethe's House: The Goethe's House is adjacent to the Goethe Museum, where the famous German poet
 Johann Wolfgang Goethe was born on August 28, 1749, and spent his teenage years here.
- Zeilstraße: Located in the heart of Frankfurt, this is a famous local shopping street, dating back to the 14th century, lined with shops.
- Main: Frankfurt is called Frankfurt am Main, which adds a tenderness to this modern metropolis known for its financial industry, exhibitions and transportation.
