DAY 1 UNITED STATES TRAVEL TO > ROMA BY INTERNATIONAL FLIGHT

DAY 2 ROMA

The Eternal City [Rome] is a good place for tourists interested in history and civilization from all over the world to explore the ancient world, not only retaining the relics of the original Roman Empire era, but also preserving the flavor of modern "Roman Holiday"

Panthon: A fine example of ancient Rome's masterful architectural techniques, Michelangelo praised it as "the design of angels". The Pantheon is located in the center of Rome, its vestibule is Piazza Rotonda, there is a fountain with a tall pointed square monument carved with scenes from ancient Roman mythology

Castel Sant'Angelo: is a castle in Rome, Dali, Italy, located on the banks of the Tiber River, near the Vatican, now a museum and one of the local tourist attractions

Piazza di Spagna: Located under the hill where the Church of the Holy Trinity in Rome, Italy, is located. The church has 137 steps, named after the nearby Spanish embassy, where the movie "Roman Holiday" was filmed.

DAY 3 ROMA

St. Peter's Basilica Peter's Basilica (enter, not to the top): The largest church in the world, also known as St. Peter's Basilica and Vatican Basilica. Constantly designed and perfected by architects such as Bramentte and Michelangelo, it is a Catholic religious temple in the Vatican

Piazza San Pietro: Located in front of the cathedral, Piazza San Pietro was built in the 17th century as a meeting place for Christianity, and standing on such a magnificent square, you will be struck by its majestic grandeur Vatican Museums Musei Vatitani (admission included): One of the oldest museums in the world, the museum brings together Egyptian, Greek and Roman antiquities and Renaissance art, the result of centuries of collection and accumulation by the Roman Catholic Church.

Sistine Chapel (admission included): The private prayer hall of the Pope of Rome, where the pope's election ceremony takes place.

Four Raphael Rooms Stanze di Raffaello (with tickets): a group of rooms in the Vatican Palace, the common part of the Pope's residence. Notable for the frescoes created by Raphael and his studio. Together with Michelangelo's ceiling painting in the Sistine Chapel, it constitutes a grand series of frescoes that mark the Roman Renaissance.

DAY 4 Rome - Florence

Colosseo: The site is located in the heart of Rome, the capital of Italy. Also translated as the Roman Gladiatorial Arena and the Colisim Arena, it is a place for slave owners, nobles and free people in the ancient Roman Empire to watch the fighting beasts or slave fights, and it is also a witness of the glorious era of the Roman Empire.

Arco di Costantino: The latest of the three surviving triumphal arches in the city of Rome. Constantine the Great was founded to celebrate the unification of the empire.

Forum Romanum: The center of the city in ancient Roman times, strolling around the square is like stepping back in time to the ancient Roman Empire.

Fontana di Trevi: Because there are three roads in front of the fountain that extend outward, the "Trevi Trevi" of the Trevi Fountain means three forks in the road, which is the origin of the fountain's name. The Trevi Fountain fountain is the last masterpiece of Baroque architecture in Rome, the largest and most well-known fountain in Rome, and therefore one of the symbols of Rome, and the movie "Roman Holiday" became a famous fountain after it swept the world!

Piazza Venezia: The circular square of the city of Rome, modeled after Piazza San Marco in Venice, is surrounded by many historical buildings, museums, and galleries

The Mouth of Truth Bocca della verità is a marble carving, resembling a human face, located in the portico of the Greek Church of Our Lady of Greece in Rome, Italy. It may depict a god from an ancient Greek or Roman religion. The most famous feature of the Mouth of Truth is that it is used for lie detection. In the Middle Ages, it was believed that if someone lied, his hand would be bitten when he reached into his mouth.

DAY 5 Florence - Pisa

Cattedrale di Santa Maria del Fiore: The most important landmark in Florence, consisting of a church, a baptistery, a bell tower, the main entrance of which received the nickname "Gate of Heaven" due to the praise of Master Michelangelo.

Campanile di Giotto: It is an 82-meter-high, quadrangular columnar tower that combines three colours in a geometric scheme to harmonize with the cathedral.

Baptistery of San Giovanni Battistero di S. Glovanni: The façade is decorated with white and green marble inlays. Outside the hall there are three bronze doors with bronze reliefs of Old Testament stories, which took 28 years to complete and were called "the gates of heaven" by Michelangelo

Torre di Pisa: On the grassy Piracaud dei Miracoli, admire the stunning Leaning Tower of Pisa, one of the Seven Wonders of the World, and see the cathedral made of white marble and the Baptistery, which symbolized Pisa's golden age

Piazza dei Miracoli: Piazza dei Miracoli: Piazza dei Miracoli, also known as Piazza del Piracoli, is one of the centers of medieval art, and the four buildings in the square: Pisa Cathedral, Baptistery of San Giovan, Leaning Tower of Pisa and Baptistery Cemetery are all masterpieces of architectural art.

Pisa Cathedral Duomo di Pisa: Located in Piazza dei Miracoli, the cathedral of the Catholic Archdiocese of Pisa, the cathedral of the Catholic Archdiocese of Pisa, built in a medieval masterpiece of Romanesque architecture, the whole church is built in a very different style and elegant environment

DAY 6 Pisa - Cinque Terre - Milan

The Cinque Terre area, consisting of Monterosso, Vernacha, Conilla, Manarola and Leomajore, is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

In the Italian mind, Cinque Terre is the 'colorful Santorini'. Surrounded by agricultural terrain, the seaside villages are colorful, charming and unpretentious and form part of this Cinque Terre National Park reserve.

Take the Cinque Terre Train into the famous fishing village, where the sea and sky are narrow and long, strolling here, while the sea breeze blows the ancient ruins, and the sun reflects the Côte d'Azur.

Then head to Milan, the fashion capital!

DAY 7 Milan - Verona - Venice

Duomo di Milano (just go into inside area, we are not going to the top): This church is the most classic Gothic building, with a total area of 11,700 square meters and a tower topped by 2,245 statues of saints and 135 small spires, second only to St. Peter's Basilica in Rome.

Teatro alla Scala: One of the three largest opera houses in the world, the statue of Leonardo da Vinci, the Cloister of Amanio II in the famous store area, etc., are all must-sees.

After taking a photo in the elegant ancient city of Verona, the Colosseum Arena di Verona, stroll through the Piazza delle Erbe, an open-air market; Continuing to visit Juliet's former residence Casa di Giulietta, the courtyard is lined with verdant green vines, and the bronze statue of Juliet stands aside, and legend has it that touching Juliet's right chest can have a happy marriage, adding a mysterious and romantic atmosphere to the love of the ages.
