Day 1 Hometown ✈ Munich (Germany) 4/21 [Reference flight time: LAX/MUC 5:10P/1:15P]

Fly to Munich, Germany today! The flight arrives the next day!

Day 2 Munich 4/22

Munich's New Town Hall is a towering brown-black Gothic building built at the end of the 19th century on the north side of Marienplatz. It looks like a layer of white frost is sprinkled on it. There are statues of kings, saints and mythological heroes of Bain in the niches between the windows on its front. The entire building has a grand layout and gorgeous decoration. It took 40 years to complete from 1867.

Day 3 Munich -186km- Salt Lake District Salzkammergut (Austria) -47km- Salzburg Salzburg 4/23

and leisure resorts. There are 76 lakes in the area, connected like a pearl necklace among the Alps, showing a transcendent aura. It was officially listed by the United Nations in 1997. century cultural heritage. The most coveted town in the Lake District is the small town of Hallstatt, which is as beautiful as a fairy tale. The soft-colored European-style wooden buildings on the lakeside slopes, with the mountains as the background and the green lake as the background, are the most representative of Austria. Sexual landscape. The palace in Mirabell Gardens is dedicated to Wolf. It was built in 1606 under the order of Archbishop Diqu. The palace was originally called "Altenau", then Wolf. Diqu's successors renamed it "Mirabell". The most impressive thing about the garden is the statues with the theme of Greek mythology, the rising and falling fountains and the flower beds full of flowers. The scene of singing Do Re Mi in the movie "The Good and the Good" was filmed here.

Dream Castle ~ Schloss Neuschwanstein is a castle built by King Ludwig II of Bavaria to realize his lifelong ideals and show the spirit of chivalry in the Middle Ages; the original draft of the castle was created by theater painters and stage designers, so It retains a dreamlike and unreal feeling, which makes people excited.

Day 5 Fussen -147km- St. Gallen -68km- Vaduz (Liechtenstein) - 68.5km- Davos 4/25

The cultural and artistic center of Europe in the Middle Ages ~ St. Gallen is located between Lake Constance and Appenzell. The famous library has been designated as a World Heritage by UNESCO. The



old town that is closed to cars is decorated with brightly painted oriel windows, Beautiful boutiques and cozy cafes welcome visitors from all directions. The most famous buildings in St. Gallen are the Baroque Cathedral and the Abbey Library. The library contains approximately 140,000 books, some of which are manuscripts that have been around for thousands of years. The magnificent monastery library is probably the most beautiful Rococo-style hall in Switzerland. In 1983, the entire monastery was included in the World Heritage List. Liechtenstein is one of only two doubly landlocked countries in the world. It is also the only country whose official language is German but has no border with Germany. Although this small mountainous country with a constitutional monarchy has a small land area and a sparse population, it has an unusually high level of national income, with a per capita GDP of up to 60,000 euros. It is a country famous for its beautiful scenery in the Alps, tax havens and high living standards. of small, wealthy countries. Get off the car and visit Vaduz Castle, St. Florin's Cathedral, and the Mitteldorf neighborhood.

are displayed outside the window like a natural big screen. It is the most popular scenic train in Switzerland. , the extraordinary beauty is amazing. Zermatt, which can only be reached by train, is completely free of car pollution. It is pure and natural, like a fairyland on earth, with wooden

houses scattered among the mountains. In spring, flowers bloom on the balcony, and the Matterhorn stands proudly in the distance. A touching painting of Alpine love.

Day 7 Zermatt (Matterhorn Mountain Train) -140km- Montreux 4/27

The Matterhorn, known as the crown of Switzerland, stands proudly on the grassland under the blue sky and white clouds. It is the spiritual symbol and the most obvious symbol of Switzerland. It is also an excellent attraction that



cannot be missed when traveling in Switzerland. Take the mountain train from Zermatt and wind your way up to the Gornergrat Station at an altitude of 3130 meters. Along the way, you can enjoy the magnificent views of the Matterhorn from different angles, and finally arrive at the Gornergrat Observation Deck. , from a distance, you can see the vast glaciers and the 4,478-meter-high Matterhorn standing majestically, like the most perfect works of nature shining in the sun, worthy of its reputation as the "King of the Mountains". From the observation deck, you can also overlook more than 40 mountains with an altitude of more than 4,000 meters. The majestic scenery is panoramic and breathtaking. It will definitely make your trip worthwhile.

Day 8 Montreux -91km- Bern -123km- Interlaken 4/28

After breakfast, proceed to Chillon Castle, a majestic medieval water castle, surrounded by the beautiful Lake Geneva and the majestic Albes Mountains. Since it is built on the rocks on the shores



of Lake Geneva, it gives people a strange feeling of floating on the water from a distance. In 1816, the British poet Lord Byron wrote the famous poem "The Prisoner of Chillon" here. With its many fountains, sandstone facades, narrow streets and historic turrets, Bern's medieval atmosphere is unique. The Rose Garden above Bear Park, as well as the 101-meter-high

cathedral bell tower and platform, are good bases overlooking the old city and the River Aare. Past fortifications and forts are located on steep slopes beside the river. There are many fashion boutiques, bars, and pubs in the old city, some of which are built in ancient vaulted wine cellars. The numerous cafes in the small streets attract both locals and foreign tourists.

Day 9 Interlaken - Jungfrauoch - Lucerne -52km- Zurich 4/29

After breakfast, start the Jungfrauoch climbing trip. Arrange to take the mountaineering gear train, pass through the cave tunnel, and go to the Jungfrauoch Station, the highest railway



station in Europe, with an altitude of 3454 meters. You can visit the mountaintop ice palace carved under the glacier. Feel the unique experience of being in the glacier; you can also take the elevator to the mountaintop observation deck at an altitude of 3,571 meters, with a panoramic view of the Alpine peaks such as the Eiger and Schreck Peak. The "Eiger Express" opened on December 5, 2020, with a total length of nearly 6.5 kilometers and a total of 44 large carriages that can accommodate 26 people. Starting from Grindelwald Station at an altitude of 937 meters, it only takes 15 minutes to take the cable car up 1,391 meters to the Eiger Glacier Station at an altitude of 2,328 meters. The journey is significantly shortened by 47 minutes compared to the previous cog train ride. Visitors can enjoy There will be more time at the top to enjoy the stunning panorama.

Head to Lucerne, the most representative city in central Switzerland. The businesses on both sides of the stone paths in the old town are nostalgic and lively. The old city of Lucerne is the liveliest place, with countless souvenir shops, watch shops, clothing stores and restaurants. The squares and fountains are also very beautiful. There are colorful murals painted on the walls of many buildings, and some streets have There are medieval stone paths. The Chapel Bridge is one of Lucerne's landmarks and the oldest covered wooden bridge in Europe. This bridge was built in 1333 AD. On the roof of the bridge, there are 110 triangular wood panel paintings painted in the 17th century. Most of the contents describe the historical events of Switzerland and Lucerne. This wooden bridge spans the Louis River and is about 200 meters long. It has two turning points. There is an octagonal tower near the center of the bridge. It used to be a place where trophies and jewelry were placed during battles, and is now a souvenir shop. The Cabell Bridge was ravaged by Zhurong in August 1993. Fortunately, it was not completely burned down. Although the damaged bridge body and paintings have been restored, the old and new traces are still clearly visible. Lucerne's Sleeping Stone Lion Lion Monument was carved from a stone cliff to commemorate the Swiss mercenaries. Mark Twain once described it as "the saddest and



most touching stone sculpture in the world." The city of Zurich, with its magnificent views of the Alps, has a natural landscape of lakes and mountains. It is also known as the Garden City on the lake. The city is full of carefully maintained gardens. Walking through the city, the blooming flowers look green and old. The urban area still retains a strong medieval atmosphere and is a tourist attraction. Historical church buildings can be seen everywhere.
